27th Annual Town-Wide Tag Sales Day

On **Saturday, May 13th**, the Society will hold its 2023 Town-Wide Tag Sales Day - the 27th year of this event. It is exciting to be able to offer this event to our community and we will hopefully be back to a full compliment of over 100 sales around town streets and on country roads.

The Society is planning to hold our usual big tag sale of donated items in the yard of the Ruth Callander House. Our bake sale will be in its own space at the Callander House - under a canopy (weather permitting) or on the porch.

The Tag Sales Day is always the Society's largest fund raiser of the year supporting the maintenance and projects of the Ruth Callander House Museum of Portland History along with other Society activities to collect, preserve and share Portland's history.

Portland's big Tag Sales Day gives you an opportunity to hold a sale and be listed on our map or donate your items to our sale. Registrations for your sale are open online or by paper for \$20 until March 31. Registration between April 1-30 is \$25.


As always, we will produce our comprehensive map of Portland with the trail of sales and listings of addresses and items of those sales.

Portland Historical Society Note from the President, Julie Macksoud

It is my distinct pleasure to provide you with a brief recap of a productive year that has led us to the doorway of our 50th year of operation. We were fortunate to be the recipient of a few grants this past year, including a Cultural Fund Grant from CT Humanities to improve our information technology. We have also applied for a Good-to-Great 2.0 grant. This is a program of the Department of Economic and Community Development, which will provide funding for much needed improvements to our museum such as roof repair and better climate control. In 2022 we presented three exhibits, provided five cemetery tours, and created three newsletters. We partnered with no less than thirteen local organizations, including the Portland Grange, Boys Scouts Troop 2, and the Portland Garden Club. We held our 26th annual town-wide tag sale in May and our 11th annual Festival of Wreaths in December.

Our Trustees are reviewing our long-range plan to update and refresh it. Also, a committee to review our by-laws has been formed. We have thoughtfully weighed in on local land use issues as well as requests for demolition permits of historically important buildings. Maintaining the integrity of a historic home is a constant and expensive challenge, but also an honor and a most worthwhile investment. Careful and continued stewardship of our society's 300 year old Ruth Callander House is an ongoing labor of love.

We welcomed three new directors to our board this past year: Susan Bransfield, Deb Freitag and Frank Winiski. We are also deeply indebted to two board members who stepped back last Fall, Claire Frisbie and Alexia Belperron. Their passion for preservation, and longtime service has left us a stronger organization. They offered their time and expertise to a wide range of tasks that has rendered us better organized and more solvent. We gratefully acknowledge the numerous contributions they have made to the Portland Historical Society over many years.

Our success, during the next 50 years will depend on many things: working toward a more robust and diverse membership appealing to, and engaging with, students in the next generation, and investing in our physical plant to keep it solid, safe and accessible. We plan on offering new historical programs and exhibits, assisting researchers, and expanding our audience in both our physical and virtual spaces in 2023. We will be honoring our Portland founders by telling their stories and making them tanigible for future generations.

Please join us as we reflect on all we have accomplished over the past five decades, and on all the dreams and plans we hope to realize in the next 50 years, as we stay mindful of our legacy and true to our mission. If you are not a member of the PHS this would be an auspicious year to join us and share your talents. Your support inspires – if not allows – us to fulfill our mission and serve this special community. We would love your help, ideas, and participation as we celebrate this important milestone, and develop the special events that are in the planning process.
